I write this with a tremendous sense of loss of a friend, personally and professionally to so many of those who have attended training sessions that Ron presented through KRWA training venues. I recall the first session I organized as a new employee of KRWA. It was a very hot July 27, 1983 in Medicine Lodge, Kansas. There were 35 people attending from 15 different water systems. He has also conducted seminars in Korea, Taiwan, Saipan and Guam during his employment with Chlorinators Incorporated. In Kansas, Ron participated on scores of training sessions sponsored by KRWA.

KRWA recognized Ron in 2014 with its "Friend of Rural Water Award".
